WINTERIZING YOUR RV

FIRST THINGS FIRST
☐ Decide if you will be taking your RV to a maintenance shop or winterizing it yourself
DOING IT YOURSELF? □ Prepare the interior and exterior: □ Empty and clean the entire RV out □ Check the inside and outside for cracks that need to be re-sealed □ Clean/wash the outside □ Take action to eliminate any existing odor □ Consult your owner's manual for winterizing instructions, valve locations, or if you are confused
DRAIN AND ANTIFREEZE
☐ Drain the entire plumbing system and fill it with antifreeze
$oldsymbol{\Box}$ Fill the radiator and windshield washer with a solution containing antifreeze
ENGINES, TIRES, AND BATTERIES □ Fill the tank, get a stabilizer, run the engine, etc.
☐ Check the tire pressure and inflate to the recommened pressure, protect them using leveling jacks/outside jacks/by rotating them a few times during the winter, for extra precaution put something between the tires and the ground
☐ Fully charge, remove, and safely store the batteries OR plan to leave the batteries in and fire up your RV once a month and plugging it in to shore power for 8 hours
STORAGE ☐ Store your RV somewhere dry, covered, and on solid ground and if you can, check on your RV a few times during the off-season
INSURANCE

☐ Talk to your agent

☐ Take an inventory and check your policy for programs, discounts, limits, and exclusions
